



# Turkey Pin

There's no better symbol for Thanksgiving than a colorful Tom Turkey. Children can create this cute turkey pin from clay and then baking it in the oven. Add a pin fastener and then give the pin to a friend to share the spirit of the Thanksgiving holiday with someone special.

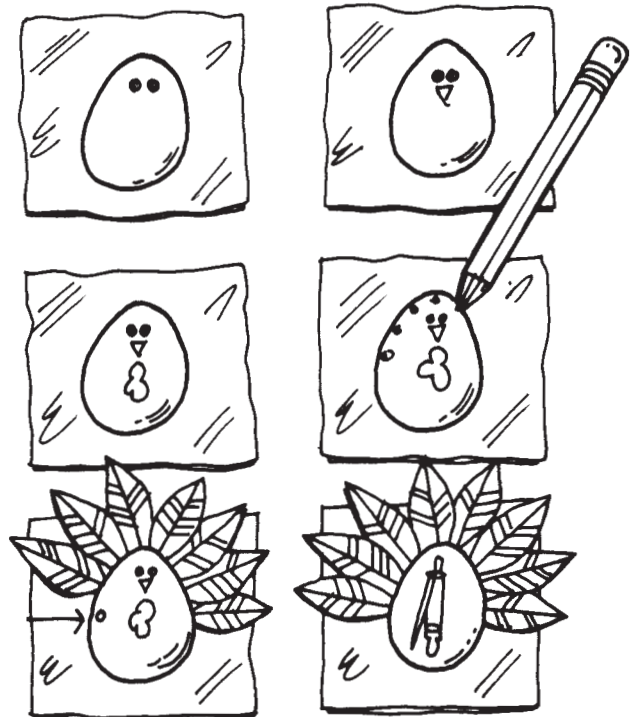
## Materials needed:

- ⊙ oven-bake modeling clay (brown, red, and yellow)
- ⊙ small black seed beads
- ⊙ pin back
- ⊙ small colored feathers
- ⊙ pencil
- ⊙ small square of aluminum foil
- ⊙ glue
- ⊙ cookie sheet
- ⊙ oven



## Directions:

1. Form small pieces of brown clay into the shape of an egg. Place the egg shape onto the piece of foil. Press down on the clay so the back flattens slightly.
2. Press two black beads into the clay for eyes.
3. Shape a small beak from yellow clay and a snood from red clay. Press the pieces onto the brown clay to form the face.
4. Using the pencil point, poke a row of holes along the sides and top as shown. These will be holes for inserting the feathers.
5. Place the turkey face and foil onto the cookie sheet. Bake it according to the clay manufacturer's directions. Remove from the oven and let it cool.
6. Dip the ends of the small feathers into glue and place them into the holes around the face.
7. Glue a pin fastener to the back and let dry.



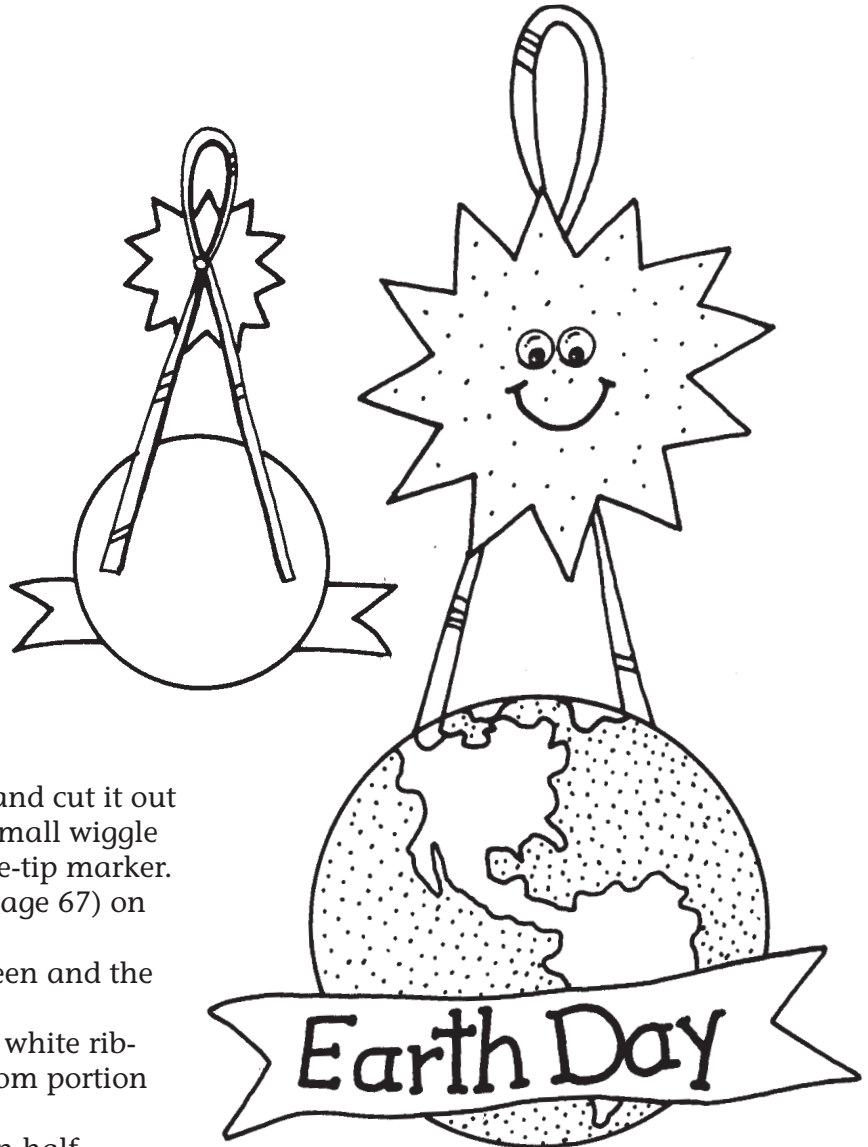


# Earth Day Hanger

Your students can show that they have the spirit of Earth Day when they create this handsome Earth Day hanger. Although it is nice to plan outdoor activities for Earth Day, the weather may not always be cooperative. This craft activity can become a great indoor way to celebrate Earth Day! Use the finished products to decorate your classroom or hallways.

## Materials needed:

- ⊙ patterns on page 67
- ⊙ 15 in. (38 cm) length of narrow white ribbon
- ⊙ 5 in. (13 cm) length of 1 in. (25 mm) wide white ribbon
- ⊙ card stock
- ⊙ glue
- ⊙ yellow, light blue, and green craft foam
- ⊙ black fine-tip marker
- ⊙ green paint pen
- ⊙ wiggly eyes
- ⊙ scissors



## Directions:

1. Use the sun pattern (page 67) and cut it out of yellow craft foam. Glue on small wiggly eyes and draw a smile with fine-tip marker.
2. Reproduce the Earth pattern (page 67) on card stock for each student.
3. Color the land on the Earth green and the oceans blue.
4. Write "Earth Day" on the wide white ribbon and glue it across the bottom portion of the earth.
5. Fold the narrow white ribbon in half.
6. Tie a knot 5 in. (13 cm) down from the fold.
7. Glue the sunburst over the knot.
8. Glue the ends of the white ribbon to the back of the earth as shown.
